Coronavirus Update

The Coronavirus pandemic is placing severe restrictions on how the Practice can operate. As things are changing, sometimes on a daily basis, I thought it might be worth recording the changes that have taken place at the surgery over the past few weeks.

The CCG are in the process of setting up hubs in East, West & City localities. These hubs would see patients with potential Covid-19. Home visits could also be requested and the clinicians would be fully kitted out when visiting patients. This is in the early planning stages but the CCG are making reasonable attempts to put things in place as quickly as possible.

Physical Protection Equipment (PPE) kits are in short supply, however, the surgery had received masks, gloves and aprons.

Home working for staff members is an issue at present, as not all the technology is in place to enable staff to gain access to the surgery systems. This is currently being worked on, but the NHS IT support people are being inundated with requests from the many GP surgeries across the county.

Pharmacies are struggling with their workload at present therefore, they are stopping dosette boxes. This is confusing some patients and District Nurses are being called out to remind patients to take their medications. The CCG have been asked to look into this.

Discussions are being held with Glenfield Pharmacy with a view to prescribing 6 months' worth of medication. This would help reduce the number of times a patient has to leave their home to collect medication. We will keep you informed of progress.

Patients are reminded that they can only have their medication when it was due, as some patients are trying to order medications well before their due date in order to stockpile.

Chest X-ray Policy

CXR open access clinics have now been suspended and appointments will have to be made for patients. Any patient just turning up will be asked to leave.

Online appointment booking

At present the facility to make appointments online has been withdrawn. Any patient requiring an appointment will have to telephone the surgery. Before the patient attends the surgery, the doctor will telephone the patient and if they deem it necessary to see the patient, they will invite the patient to attend the surgery.

Monday evening surgery

This surgery has been suspended for the present time.
